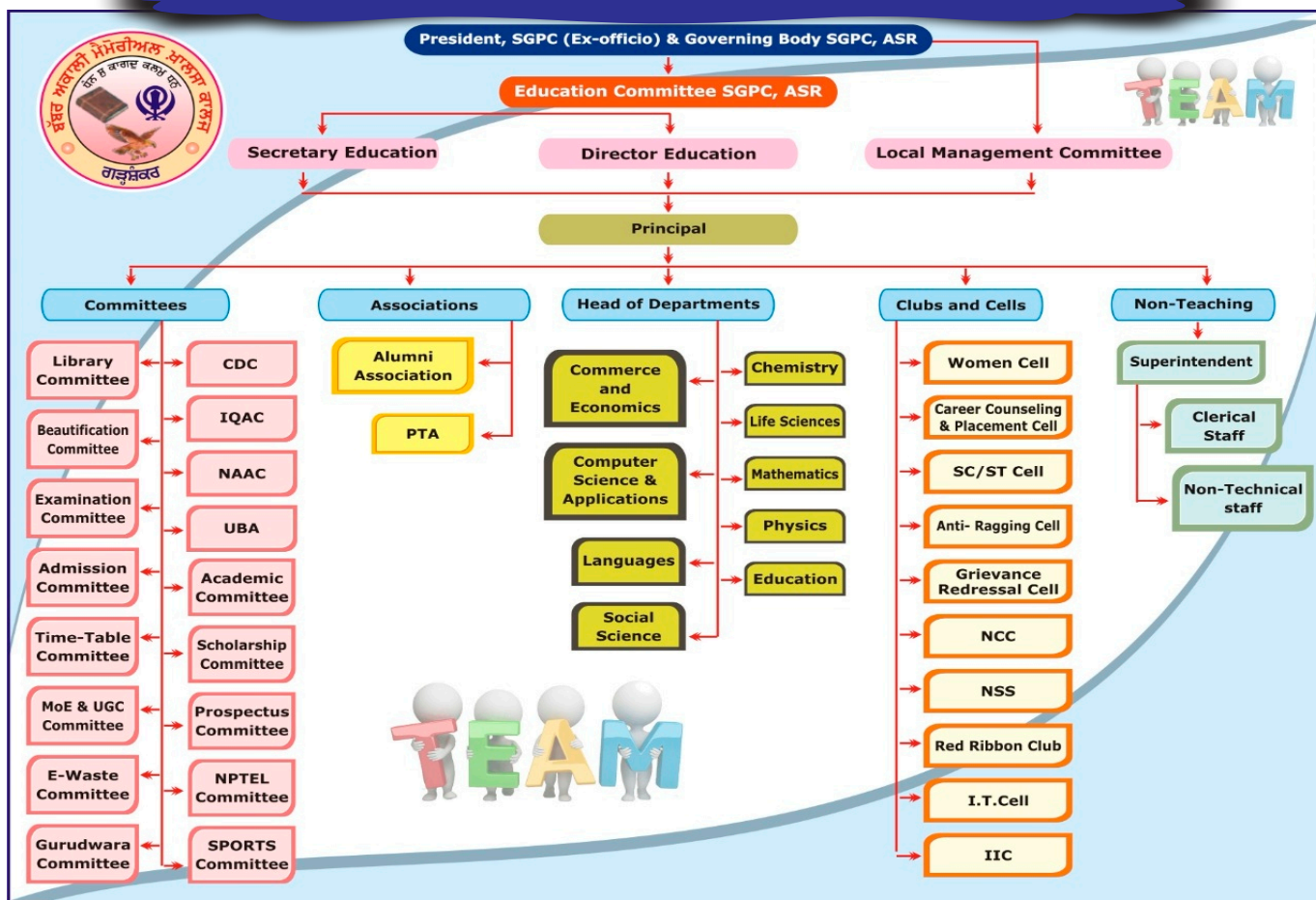

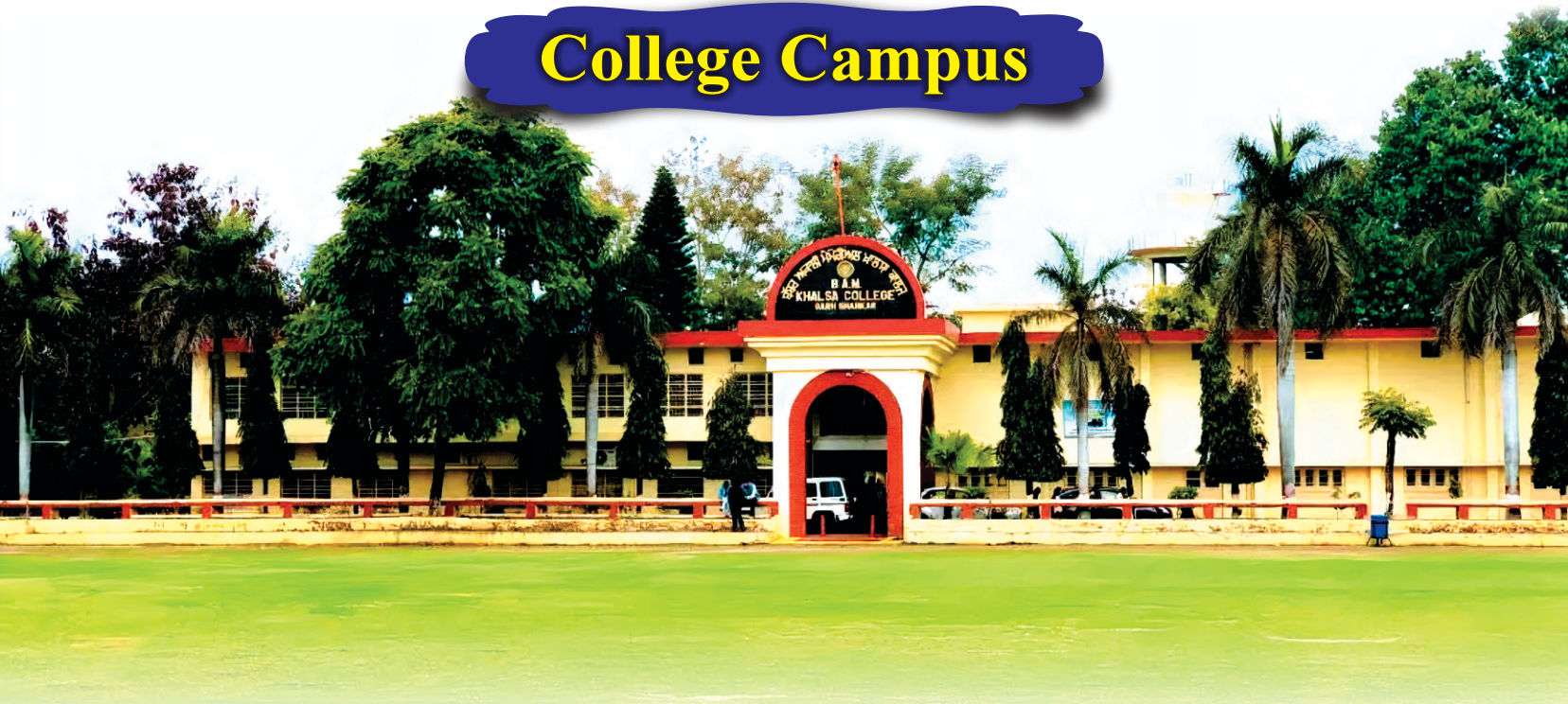

LABORATORIES

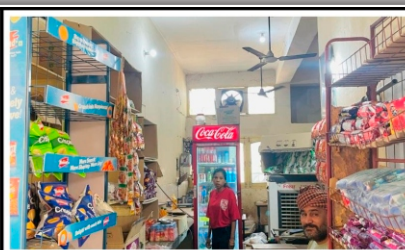
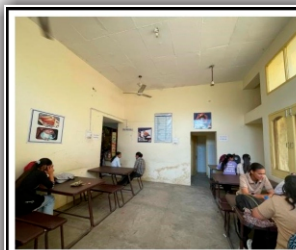

1. POST-MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDENTS BELONGING TO THE MINORITY COMMUNITIES

The scheme is Central Sector Scheme and 100% funding is provided by the Ministry of Minority Affairs. The objective of the scheme is to award scholarships to meritorious students belonging to economically weaker sections of minority community.

Scholarship will be awarded to the students who have secured not less than 50% marks or equivalent grade in the previous final examination and the annual income of whose parents/guardians from all sources does not exceed Rs.2.00 lakh.

The scheme is implemented through the National Scholarship Portal (NSP). It is mandatory for all students to apply online on the website i.e. www.scholarships.gov.in. and submit the form with requisite documents in the college.

2. CENTRAL SECTOR SCHEME OF SCHOLARSHIP FOR COLLEGE AND UNIVERSITY STUDENTS

To provide financial assistance to meritorious students from low income families to meet a part of their day-to-day expenses while pursuing higher studies. The scholarships are awarded on the basis of the results of Senior Secondary Examination. Students who are above 80th percentile of successful candidates in the relevant stream from the respective Board of Examination in Class XII of 10+2 pattern or equivalent and their parental/family income ceiling is Rs. 8 lakh per annum for all categories are eligible to apply.

The scheme is implemented through the National Scholarship Portal (NSP). It is mandatory for all students to apply online on the website i.e. www.scholarships.gov.in.and submit the form with requisite documents in the college.

3. POST GRADUATE INDIRA GANDHI SCHOLARSHIP FOR SINGLE GIRL CHILD

The objective of the proposed scheme is to support post graduate education of single girl child in postgraduate courses only. The details of Indira Gandhi Single Girl Child Scholarship eligibility criteria are given below.

- Applicants must be admitted into the regular, full-time 1st year master's degree course in any designated university or postgraduate college.
- The girl candidates must be the only child of her parents. The candidates must not have any brother, though the girl students who are twin daughters/ fraternal daughters may apply for this UGC scholarship.
- The candidates must not be more than 30 years of age at the time of admission into the PG programme

4. POST GRADUATE MERIT SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR UNIVERSITY RANK HOLDERS AT UNDER GRADUATE LEVEL

The First and Second Rank holders at undergraduate level and admitted in any Postgraduate Course would be awarded the scholarship. The scholarship is available to the student for first PG Degree only. Age limit for the students is 30 years at the time of admission in PG course. The scholarship will provide the financial aid of INR 3,100 per month for the duration of two years.

5. POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP IN HINDI FOR STUDENTS FROM NON-HINDI SPEAKING STATES

The main object of the scheme is to encourage the study of Hindi in Non-Hindi speaking states. Candidates who belong to Non-Hindi Speaking States and have taken Hindi as a elective subject in B.A. are eligible for a scholarship.

6. PUNJAB STATE MERIT SCHOLARSHIP

This merit based scholarship is funded by Punjab Government on the basis of marks obtained in B.A./B.Sc. Students who have secured more than 60% marks in B.A./B.Sc. and have taken admission in first year of M.A./M.Sc. are eligible to apply.

7. SCHOLARSHIP PROVIDED BY SITA RAM JINDAL TRUST

This scheme offers Scholarships for the students to pursue courses after Matriculation. The students, whose parental or guardians' income is less than Rs. 4 Lac p.a. are eligible to apply. The Scholarship form is available on the Dr. Ambedkar Scholarship portal and interested applicants have to apply online and submit requisite documents to the college. The scholarship amount is transferred via Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) to the applicants' bank account.

10. POST MATRIC SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR OBC STUDENTS

Post Matric Scholarship Scheme has been solely put forth to offer financial support to the economically weaker students from the other backward cast. This scheme offers scholarships for the students to pursue course after matriculation. The students, whose parental or guardian's income is less than 1Lakh P.A. are eligible to apply. The scholarship form is available on the Dr. Ambedkar Scholarship Portal and interested applicants have to apply online and submit requisite documents to the college. The

scholarship amount is transferred via direct benefit transfer(DBT) to the applicant's bank account.

11.III SOCIETY OF SCIENCE STUDENTS SCHOLARSHIP FOR MERITORIOUS & FINANCIALLY WEEK STUDENTS

III Society of Science Students is a non-profitable society run by Science Department of B.A.M. Khalsa College. Funds for the society are collected from college Science Students, Teachers, Principal and from some organizations and individuals. Minimum of 10% of total funds collected during whole academic session is used for providing scholarships for meritorious and needy students of B.Sc., B.Sc. B.Ed. and M.Sc. Minimum 75% attendance in the current session and 70% marks in the previous year final examination is required to apply for scholarship.

12. THE COL O.P. LAMBA AND SMT. KRISHNA LAMBA MERIT AWARD

The objective of the scheme is to provide financial assistance, in the form of scholarship to poor and meritorious student of BSc Med or BSc Non Med of first year to encourage him/her to pursue higher education. The scholarship amount is sponsored by Col O.P. Lamba and Smt. Krishna Lamba. One student will be selected from first year BSc Med or BSc Non Med Program on the basis of merit in class 12. The scholarship amount will be 5000/-.

13.S. BALBIR SINGH SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME

The main objective of S. Balbir Singh Scholarship Scheme is to provide financial assistance to the economically weak and meritorious students. A student from first year BCA and B.A (with Elective Punjabi) will be selected based on Merit position in the 12th class. The scholarship will be continued for the whole program. The students who are pursuing pre and post-matric classes such as classes from 6th to 12th, UG, PG degree and diploma or polytechnic courses and also hold the beneficiary category of EWS can apply online under the **Tata Capital Pankh Scholarship** for getting the scholarship amounts. The students will need to secure at least 60% marks for getting the online registration. For providing social security and social welfare to the citizens or students belonging to the EWS communities, **Tata Capital Pankh Scholarship** has been launched by the governmental authorities. Scholarships will be provided to the students studying in classes from 6th to 12th and the students holding UG, PG and Professional degrees.

General Rules and Regulations

Change of Subject: -

1. If any student wants to change the subject, he can change the subject within 15 days from the commencement of classes by paying a fee of Rs.20. Changing the subject after the stipulated time will not be allowed.
2. Letter regarding change of subject should be given to the principal.
3. The application must be signed by the students Father /Guardian and the concerned teacher.

Internal Assessment for the Student:-

Internal Assessment of BA / B.SC / B.Com / BCA / PGDCA students will be 10% (20% for B.A.B.Ed/B.Sc.B.Ed) of each subject. It will be sent on the basis of 50% marks obtained from the students' performance in MST, 30% on the basis of students' performance in academic activities (Seminar, Project and Assignment) and 20% on the basis of class attendance of the students.

Migration College to College:-

The students transferring the college should submit an application to the principal with the signature of the student and his/her father/Guardian. All fees, penalties and other dues are required to be paid for such student before the written permission of the principal regarding transfer of college.

Reservation of seats for SC/BC /ST/ OBC & other:-

Seats for SC/ST/BC/OBC classes and other candidates as per the order of Punjab Government will be reserved as under:-

Admission of 64% of the seats will be on merit basis only. The remaining 36% seats are reserved for the following categories:

1. 25% for Scheduled Castes.
2. 5% for Backward Castes
3. 2% for children of officers working in armed force, CRPF, BSF. It will also include officers' children who have passed away.
4. 2% for players
5. 2% for teacher's children
6. One additional seat each for the student who

suffers from cancer, AIDS and Thalassemia in each course in the college.

7. Two additional seats for single girl child for admission in each course in the college.

NOTE-

- A. SC/ST/BC/OBC and other candidates are required to submit their category certificates along with the form at the time of admission.
- B. Candidates of SC/ST/BC/OBC will have to give the certificate of income at the time of admission.
- C. If the required seats in the categories mentioned above are not filled, then seats will be filled up from the general category as per the merit.

Fines

Absence penalties will be levied as per university rules and other fines will be levied by the college as per the decision of various committees.

Mode of Fee Payment

College fees will be paid in the following manner in three installments.

1. First installment: At the time of admission (1st /3rd/5th/7th semester) including university admission fees.
2. Second installment: October/November (2nd/4th/6th/8th Semester) including university examination fee.
3. Third installment February/March (Full & Final) including university examination fee and university charges.
4. Regarding the payment of fees, the following rules will be strictly enforced:
 - A. It is in the best interest of student to pay his/her fees on time to avoid penalty.
 - B. If a student leaves the college without giving notice as per the schedule of the college mentioned above, he will have to pay the penalty along with the amount for the entire term. Absence from college for any reason will not be considered as an excuse for delay in fees.
 - C. Fees paid once will not be refunded.
 - D. A student whose name is deducted once for non-payment of fees, will be able to re-enter

with re-admission fee which is subject to fees and penalties.

- E. The date of payment of the fee may be extended by the principal. For this the concerned students have to get an application from their father/guardian to be approved by the principal.

Fee Concession: -

1. Students who appear in the university merit list will be given 50% tuition fee concession.
2. The Candidates will attach with his/her fee waiver application a fee waiver certificate issued by the head of the previous institution where the students have been studying and a certificate of all kinds of income from the Father/Guardian.
3. Candidates for fee waiver will appear before a committee constituted by the principal where fee concession will be given in a reasonable manner.
4. A List of names of students who have received student Aid fund will be posted on the notice board.
5. Fee concession, allowances and stipends can be withdrawn without warning due to poor academic performance, high absenteeism and guilty of misconduct.
6. If a student receiving a student assistance fund migrates or leaves college before taking the university exam, he or she will have to repay all the assistance received from the beginning.

Sibling Fee Concession: -

Eligible student siblings or siblings are also given a fee waiver.

Refund of Security: -

Security will be paid on student's request when:

-
1. The students drop out of college or migrate to another institution.
 2. The students take the board/university exam.
 3. He gets result of the university examination.

Rules regarding Attendance

1. Attendance is compulsory for all students. That

student whose attendance is short and is careless about study, his/her name may be struck off before the completion of the course.

2. Every student must be punctual and must attend his/her class regularly. Student will be marked absent if he/she is late, even if the teacher allows him to come to class.
3. If any student remains absent for 7 days without giving any application, his/her name will be struck off. In this case he/she must take re-admission and his/her previous attendance will not be counted.
4. Teacher will talk about the attendance to the students regularly. College expects Parents/Guardians to ask their wards or teacher about their attendance.
5. Attendance report will be sent to the students along with their result.
6. 75% attendance is compulsory to sit in university examination (80% in case of B.A.B.Ed. and B.Sc.B.Ed. course).

Re Admission: -

A student whose name is deducted once for non-payment of fees or absentees, will be able to re-enter with re-admission fee which is subject to fees + penalties.

Regarding Leave: -

1. In order to be absent from college, leave should be taken only for very important work.
2. The leave will be taken in person before the leave is taken. However, in case of serious illness the leave should be applied to the office in the college working hours.
3. In case of illness the application must be accompanied by a doctor's medical certificate.
4. The application must be on an approved application form.
5. The leave application signed by the student's Father/Guardian.
6. Head of Department /Teachers can approve leaves for three days only Principal can approve more than 3 days leave.
7. In case the student is on leave than also the student has to pay the fee and return the library books on time.

General Rules and Regulations

8. Only Principal can give leaves during house examination (MST).

House Examination

To check the performance of student there will be house test as three times. Student must be well prepared for house test; information about house test will be given in advance. Other than house test teacher can take class tests also.

Examination Rules: -

1. All students must sit for all class tests and examination.
2. Due to illness or any other reason, leave for examination days has to be taken from Principal . Application will not be accepted upon completion of the examination.
3. In case of illness, the leave application must be accompanied by a doctor's medical certificate.
4. In case of non-payment of college fees, the student will not be allowed to appear in the home/university examination. Therefore, students should ensure payment of fees before the examination.
5. Only Punjab University examination rules will apply.

University Examination: -

University – Only students who meet the following conditions will be eligible to sit for the semester examination of the university.

1. A student who has achieved 75% (80% in B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc.B.Ed. course) of the total attendance for the entire semester.
2. As per the rules of the current semester in Punjab university.

NOTE:- Special test will be taken with the approval of Principal. The student will have to get 30% marks in each subject. If the student still does not fulfill the condition, then he will not be able to sit in the semester examination.

Lecture Shortage: -

The student must attend their respective classes. According to the rules of the university, if a

student's attendance is low then he/she will not be able to sit for the house/ university examination.

Rules of Library:

1. Library cum identity card issued by the librarian must be carried by the student to the college every day.
2. Only two books for period of 14 days are issued to each student.
3. Fine of Rupee 1 per day will be charged if book is returned after due dates.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

- (1) Students are expected to have 100% attendance. However, relaxation of maximum 25% (20% (10% in 8th Semester) for B.A. B.Ed. / B.Sc. B.Ed. course) may be allowed to cater for sickness or other valid reason for shortfall.
- (2) If a student is continuously absent for a period of 15 days without permission, a notice will be sent to the parents / guardian with intimation to H.O.D.
- (3) Every student enrolled in the college shall be under disciplinary control of the college and its Departments/Institutions.
- (4) An act of indiscipline or misconduct will be considered on the part of the student if he/she gets involved in the following acts:
 - (a) Physical assault or threat to use physical force against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff or student of the college.
 - (b) If he/she remains absent from the class, test /examination or any other curricular or co- curricular activity which he/she is expected to participate in without written permission.
 - (c) If he/she carries or uses any kind of weapons.
 - (d) If he/she uses drugs or other intoxicants except those prescribed by a qualified doctor.
 - (e) Indulging in or encouraging violence or any conduct which involves moral turpitude.

General Rules and Regulations

- (f) Any form of gambling.
- (g) Smoking, use of narcotics, possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages.
- (h) Willful destruction of the property of the college or its Departments / Institutions.
- (i) Ragging in any form.

Penalties: If found guilty, the student may face following penalties depending upon the severity of the misconduct:

- (a) expelled from the college
 - (b) rusticated for a certain period
 - (c) not admitted to a course or courses of study of the college for a stated period
 - (d) be imposed with fine of specified amount of money
 - (e) be debarred from taking a university examination or examinations for one or more years.
- (5) Displaying of college ID card is mandatory in college campus. During examinations, admit cards will be carried in addition.
- (6) Students are expected to follow the dress code in the college campus. Dress should be decent and appropriate for the professional college at all occasions on all days.

Dress Code:

The following dress code would be followed by all students of the College:

- (i) Formal Dress will be worn on notified day and on special events whenever notified.

a. Male Students

They should wear Shirt, Trouser, and Saffron Turban for all students to be worn on college formal events.

b. Female Students

They should wear Kurta Salwar/Pajami suit with Dupatta & Saffron Dupatta on special occasions.

(ii) Informal Dress:

Graceful informal dress will be worn on other days.

- a. Male students are expected to wear pants/jeans with half/full sleeve collared shirts/collared plain T-shirt neatly tucked in. Sikh students will wear turban. No parnas/patkas/T-shirts with slogans or comments, pajamas, slippers are allowed in academic areas.
- b. Female students are expected to wear traditional churidar / salwar-kameez / long kurtis. Wearing of dupatta / shawl is must. Short salwar/kameez / T-shirt with slogans or comments, pajamas, slippers are strictly forbidden.

GIRLS' HOSTEL CONDUCT RULES

- (i) Each student is responsible for cleanliness and upkeep of the room allotted.
- (ii) Unauthorized person is not allowed in the hostel. If such person is found in the room of any student, she will be expelled from the hostel.
- (iii) Use of electric appliances is prohibited in the hostel without the permission of Principal.
- (iv) Students should take their meals in the mess during the time fixed by the warden.
- (v) At the time of admission in the hostel, student should mention the name and the relation of the person who will visit her in the hostel.
- (vi) Before going out of the hostel, student should take permission of the warden and make proper entry regarding this in the register.
- (vii) Hostel gate will remain locked from 6 pm to 8 am.
